Prioritizing

Part of prioritizing is considering other issues.

Sometimes you take a job but do not think about the priorities in your daily life that may interfere with it. Some things are so important that unless they are dealt with, you cannot succeed at your job.

Example:

Juan does not own a car and must rely on a bus for transportation. Working his life into bus schedules is a priority for him. He is bus savvy and never considered transportation a problem or priority when taking the job. However, his job requires him to work on Saturday, when the bus schedule is very tight. He did not consider that the bus schedule changes on Saturday and cannot guarantee his employer that he will be on time every Saturday. This interferes with his job survival because he cannot guarantee his manger that he can be at work on time.
