What is the Learner Web?

Developed at Portland State University, the [Learner Web](#) is a learning support system for adults who want to accomplish specific learning objectives or goals such as earning a GED, improving their English language or other basic skills, increasing digital literacy, transitioning to higher education, preparing for a job, or improving job-related basic skills. The system is structured by the learner's selected Learning Plan and offers self-paced instruction, face-to-face or online work with a tutor or teacher, assessments, and an electronic portfolio.

The primary focus of this pilot project will be to help adult learners develop skills and knowledge in the following areas.

- Digital literacy
- Broadband Consumer Education
- Introduction to Career Pathways
