

LITERACY AND MIGRANT FARM WORKERS

Mobility affects every aspect of the lives and learning of migrant farm workers and their families. Although migrants bring few belongings as they travel from crop to crop and from labor camp to labor camp, they do bring a wealth of experience, motivation, and resourcefulness.

The agricultural industry in Southwest Florida employs more than 16,000 seasonal employees each year. Of these employees, 90% are estimated to be migrants or individuals who come to the area specifically for these jobs. The majority of the migrant workers arrives in September or October and leave in May or June. When the dependents of the migrant workers are added, the total migrant population coming to Southwest Florida each winter reaches almost 31,000.

A study entitled, Farm Workers in Southwest Florida, found that the typical farm worker is male, between 20-40 years old, of Mexican origin and has five to six years of formal education. It is estimated that 37% of the farm workers live with their families and earn about \$7,000 annually.
