



## **Florida Family Literacy Initiative Frequently Asked Questions**

### **1. When is the due date for proposals?**

Proposals must be submitted by midnight on March 13, 2023.

### **2. How do I submit my application?**

### **3. Is my organization eligible to apply?**

Eligible organizations must be a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization or government-based agency that provides adult education, literacy, ESL, and/or family literacy instruction in Florida. See guidelines for what constitutes a family literacy program.

### **4. I'm not sure what we will do for the project-based learning section of the application. Do I have to know now?**

No, your students should help you decide. However, try to begin the process with potential ideas. To help you brainstorm, you may want to review [projects](#) listed on this website. Some examples include:

- Conduct a school play based on a favorite children's book
- Plant a community garden
- Organize a field trip to a children's museum or petting zoo
- Create a family or cultural traditions booklet

### **5. What reports must be completed throughout the grant year?**

- a. Brief mid-year progress report
- b. End-of-year final report (include student/parent surveys, program activities and results)

The required student/parent survey is still in development. It will focus on whether parents and caregivers engage in activities to support their children's literacy and language development. Examples:

- Are parents reading or looking at books more often with their children?
- Are there more children's books in the home?
- Do parents and caregivers feel better prepared to support their children's education?
- Are parents and caregivers comfortable communicating with their children's school or teachers?

**6. If I get the grant, do I need to attend the May 10-12, 2023 Florida Literacy Conference?**

No, conference attendance is optional. If you choose to attend, up to \$450 of grant funds can be budgeted for this purpose.

**7. If we are awarded a grant, when will it start?**

The grant year starts May 1, 2023, however, instructional programming is not required to start at that time. Please include a program timeline in your proposal.

**8. Can I start the application in Jotform and save my progress to complete and submit the application later?**

Yes, you can start working on the application in Jotform, save your progress, and come back to the application at a later time.
