



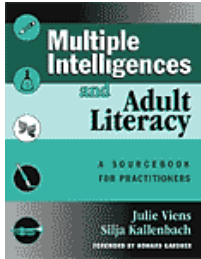

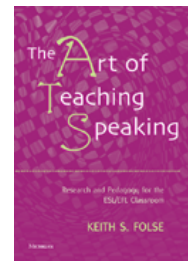


Learning Styles and Multiple Intelligences: From Theory to Lesson Plan:
