

Identifying and Solving Reading Error Patterns

Objective: Participants will learn a system for identifying and analyzing oral reading/decoding errors made by their students.



Tutors and teachers can effectively address common error patterns through a process of listening, marking and discussing errors made by students who read a brief 100-150 word passage. Participants will learn this process and receive; 1) a list of the 10 most common reading errors, and 2) sample passages that can be utilized as a guide for selecting appropriate material from a wide range of reading resources.
