In this free Webinar we'll explore activities and tasks that help learners:

- ❖ select a meaningful writing topic;
- ❖ organize their thoughts; and
- ❖ make the best use of the drafting-revising cycle.

The session will introduce writing models and prompts that are meaningful for adults; and consider editing checklists and feedback routines that help learners polish their work. We'll explore tools that help all our ESOL learners develop the pre-writing, drafting, and revising skills so critical to successful writing. We'll also discuss ways of publishing learners' work so that they (and others) can celebrate their success!
