Mindset is a simple idea that has profound implications on learning. People equipped with a growth mindset work harder, are more persistent, and perform better under pressure than people with a fixed mindset.

Research shows that student motivation, retention and resilience can be strengthened through a combination of effective learning strategies and a growth mindset, the belief that mastery can be achieved through effort.

A growth mindset curriculum developer will share ideas for applications of growth mindset principles in your instruction. We will explore how teacher feedback impacts student motivation and retention. You will walk away with concrete tools to teach your students about malleable intelligence, as well as growth mindset assessment ideas and resources.
