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FLORIDA LITERACY COALITION RECOGNIZES MARION COUNTY LITERACY COUNCIL FOR EXCELLENCE IN EDUCATION

ORLANDO, Florida (May 21, 2010) – The <u>Florida Literacy Coalition</u> recently recognized the Marion County Literacy Council (MCLC) with an Excellence in Education Award for its significant milestones in the program's growth and development. The award was presented at a special banquet held during the annual <u>Florida Literacy Conference</u> in Captiva, Fla.

In all, six awards were presented during the State Literacy Awards banquet. Nominated by Lisa Varner, president of the MCLC board of directors, MCLC was honored for their excellence in serving the residents of Marion County to reduce illiteracy and expanding its programs' capacities.

In 1999 MCLC was established in a Marion County garage. Since its humble beginning, MCLC has grown into a reputable and established community-based organization. After becoming a United Way agency in 2004, the Council hired an executive director and later a full-time program director. Together, over the past two years, the staff and the board of directors worked to double the size of the program, serving more than 150 students in 2009, and sustained a dedicated volunteer base of more than 80 tutors. With this expansion, MCLC relocated to a new office which also accommodates a new computer lab for students. Currently MCLC is working towards

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a ProLiteracy national accreditation and for its thriving ESOL and adult basic literacy programs.

"Marion County's staff and board should be most proud of their achievements," said Greg Smith, executive director of the Florida Literacy Coalition. "The Marion County Literacy Council is doing a great job providing much-needed literacy services in the area."

Smith and Zelda Rogers, Senior Program Director for adult education with the Florida Department of Education, presented the award to Karen Hill, MCLC executive director, and Marisol Sepulveda, MCLC program director.
